On November 9, 2005, the Company announced that it had changed its name from Neothermia Corporation to Intact Medical Corporation, and had concurrently changed the name of its breast biopsy product from the *en-bloc*[®] Biopsy System to the ***Intact***[™] Breast Lesion Excision System.

Founded in 1998, and based in Natick, Massachusetts, Intact Medical Corporation is a privately held company focused on the design, development and marketing of innovative, minimally invasive systems for the volumetric excision of tissue for diagnostic and therapeutic applications in select cancer markets. The Company's lead product, the ***Intact***[™] Breast Lesion Excision System, received marketing clearance from the Food and Drug Administration in June 2001. Initial products are targeted at breast biopsy and the excision of benign lesions, potentially obviating the need for open surgical excisions. In August 2005, the company received expanded approval for the System, allowing its use to obtain tissue samples for histologic examination with partial or complete removal of an imaged abnormality, or partial removal of a palpable abnormality that has been classified as benign.
